Colin Good, piano

Colin has spent his life in music since becoming a chorister at Magdalen College, Oxford, at the

age of nine, and later reading music along the High at Queen's. But he was soon drawn inexorably towards the London jazz scene, fast winning a reputation as a skilled arranger and a hip hard-driving piano soloist. Influenced by Earl Hines and Teddy Wilson, Colin Good once toured with The Ink Spots, and has composed regularly for theatre, television and film.

Colin's role as a nightclub pianist in Sir Iain McKellen's modern dress film of *Richard III* brought him into contact with Bryan Ferry. Colin was the natural choice as keyboard artist for the *Best of Roxy Music* tour that followed, and as arranger, co-producer and pianist he has been at the heart of Bryan's album *Frantic* (2002). Colin has composed new arrangements for Oxford Youth Choirs with Roderick Williams, and last year they worked together on a jazz project for BBC Radio 3.

Richard Vendome, musical director

Richard Vendome was born and brought up in Oxford, and as a child was more interested in art and design than in music, although he was encouraged to sing from an early age. Serious interest in music began when he was given a piano for his 14th birthday, and he took his first job as an organist and choirmaster just three months later. He went on to study organ, piano and composition at the Royal College of Music, singing as a countertenor in various London choirs, and returning to run the music at St Giles' Church in Oxford at weekends. Richard then won a scholarship to the Queen's College, Oxford, where he continued his organ studies with James Dalton. He started a secular boys' choir (Colin Good was a founder member) and later directed the chapel music at Exeter College, where one of his choirboys was Roderick Williams. His interest in design re-emerged when, as a research student, he began to develop algorithms for the computerized printing of music, winning a British Technology Group research fellowship in 1984, and a British Computer Society Medal in 1990.

Richard founded the Oxford Girls' Choir in 1984 to fill a gap in Oxford's musical life, which at that time had plenty of choral opportunities for boys, but none for girls. Starting with a dozen singers, some of whom now sing professionally, it is now part of Oxford Youth Choirs, an educational charity with 150 members aged 4—18 years old.
